The single block vineyard is special in that the 45th parallel goes through it. Located on the Montalon hillside at the highest point of the appellation, Château le Peuy Saincrit benefits from exceptionally favourable natural conditions. The hillside's southern exposure means that it has abundant sunlight and almost complete protection from climatic hazards such as frost and hailstorms. The vineyard has a high percentage of old vines. They lie on a rocky soil bed covered by a thin layer of clay-limestone which is one of the best assurances for wine quality.



OUR COMMITMENT: TO RESPECT OUR TERROIR

Château Le Peuy Saincrit practices integrated precision-viticulture and is also engaged in the process for HVE level 3 certification.

In order to preserve our terroir we have put several measures into action.

- For example we undertake winter sowing and leave certain plots to lie fallow. This ancient technique is very beneficial for the vine and for the soil.
- We also use ecological reservoir zone in order to preserve biodiversity in the vineyard. They are essential to maintain the right balance at the property.
- We are very close to our vines, we observe them carefully every day so that we only need to apply treatments which are necessary.





Château Le Peuy Saincrit has a beautiful brilliant ruby-coloured robe with garnet highlights. On the nose it reveals notes of blackberries and spice.

It is attractive and ample on the palate with powerful aromas of cherry jam and liquorice.

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Mis en Bouteille au Château



Château Le Peuy Saincrit uses traditional vinification methods in stainless steel thermo-regulated vats. Cold pre-fermentation maceration takes place for 10 days to ensure that the fresh fruit aromas are preserved.
