A PROPERTY FULL OF HISTORY.

To the South of the locality known as **Montrose** and just next to the village of Cos we find the two hamlets of German and Marbuzet.

A remarkable cross erected by the villagers in 1882 is situated in the middle of the domain between the two parts of the vineyards of **German** and of **Marbuzet**.



The name **Marbuzet** would appear to come from the Latin 'marga' meaning marl and from 'buxea' meaning surrounded by boxwood. It is a name which characterises the property's terroir very well, composed for the most part of clay-limestone gravel, just like those of the best Cru Bourgeois

SAINT ESTÈPHE: AN EXCEPTIONAL TERROIR.





Three exceptional plots situated on gravel rises contribute to the production of wines from Chateau German Marbuzet.

Here the wines cover the plateau which dominates the Gironde River. The soils here are well known for being a quality terroir of gravel and clay-limestone from which one of the best wines in the appellation is made.

The wind, which is a good thing for the vines, blows a special salty air.



OUR COMMITMENT: TO RESPECT THE ENVIRONMENT AND OUR TERROIR.

We do everything we can to preserve our precious terroir: we employ integrated vineyard management techniques; we till the soils and allow the grass to grow between the rows of vines.

Since vintage 2019 Chateau German Marbuzet wines have been certified HVE3 (High Environmental Value)

IN THE CELLAR

After meticulously sorting the grapes both during harvesting and upon arrival at the wine cellar, vinification plot by plot takes place in small stainless steel vats.

Extraction is light and reasoned.

Ageing is carried out in quality oak barrels for a period of 18 months.

On the palate the wine is smooth, well-balanced and has great length. It develops notes of plum jam and vanilla.
