

CHATEAU PEYREDOULLE

Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux



AN EXCEPTIONAL TERROIR

Chateau Peyredoulle's vineyards are situated in the commune of Berson, at the heart of the Blaye region. The estate has 21 hectares which benefit in particular from a privileged exposure.

The name of the Chateau, 'Peyredoulle', means 'Pierre Dure' (hard stone) in the local dialect.

Chateau Peyredoulle dates back to the 16th Century. At that time it belonged to the famous Italian philosopher and humanist Pic de la Mirandole. It was sold in 1685 to the Lavergne family who kept it for over two centuries. In 1867 the Chateau underwent major modifications. From the original construction there only remains a small square pavilion with a gable rooftop.

GARDEN SIDE

Chateau Peyredoulle which is a property with an excellent reputation in the Blaye region belongs to the Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux appellation and is situated on one of the best clay-limestone hilltops in the area.

Overlooking the Gironde estuary the Blaye region's vineyards are made up of rich and varied terroirs. Rolling hillsides contrast with the almost marine horizon



on the banks of the estuary which have played such an important part in the history of this area.

The vineyard's ideal sun exposure means that the Merlot grape can express its full aromatic potential.

Thanks to these natural conditions and the know-how of the owners, Chateau Peyredoulle makes a high-quality wine.



COURT SIDE

The red wines from the **Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux appellation**, which are characterised by a large proportion of the Merlot grape variety, reveal a deep colour and fruity notes.

Vinification takes place in thermo-regulated stainless steel vats. Thanks to a cold pre-fermentation maceration lasting several days, Chateau Peyredoulle wines keep all their freshness and fruity aromas.
